School Notices

- **Bee Healthy Regional Dental Service** are pleased to inform you we are able to start doing dental checks from Sacred Heart School at level 2. We can examine any student who is well (from class) using strict infection prevention and control processes. Your child's temperature may be checked with a thermometer prior to entering the clinic. If a child has a temperature higher than 38°we will defer your child's examination until they are well. Parents should contact us on 0800Talkteeth if they do not want their child to receive their dental check at school. This will be recorded in the child's notes as either a temporary or permanent consent change. As usual students will be walking down to the hub clinic and during this time we will be prioritising Year 8 students.
