#### COVID19- Alert Level 2 Noon Today until midnight Friday From noon today we are back in Alert level 2. This means:

- Please drop your children outside the gate and pick them up from outside the gate. Junior children will come out slightly earlier to the gate.
- Everyone is to come in the main gate
- Children will be reminded of their "Moist breath zone" and to keep their personal hygiene practices going.
- All children MUST have their own named drink bottle
