Celebrating Our School and Students

ANZAC day marks the anniversary of the landing of Australian and New Zealand soldiers – the Anzacs – on the Gallipoli Peninsula in 1915. The aim

was to capture the Dardanelles and open a sea route to the Bosphorus and the Black Sea. At the end of the campaign, Gallipoli was still held by its Ottoman Turkish defenders.

Thousands lost their lives during the Gallipoli campaign: 87,000 Ottoman Turks, 44,000 men from France and the British Empire, including 8500 Australians. To this day, Australia also marks the events of 25 April.



Among the dead were 2779 New Zealanders, about one in six of those who served on Gallipoli.

On ANZAC day our lovely school leaders represented Sacred Heart Petone at the ANZAC service. They were part of the parade and laid a wreath and we are very proud of them.

Some were finding it really hard but no one put them down. I heard a lot of "come on, finish hard" and "we can take it slow, we just need to finish". There was no teacher that I could see with the first class and they appeared to be older, but that didn't mean they forgot who they were once they were out of the teacher's sight. I thought that it must have been a one-off. But no, about 15 minutes later another class came. They were younger and had a teacher with them. Again the students were going hard encouraging each other. Cheering as the last ones came over the finish line. Doing another round just to support the slower ones. It was like a little party/celebration and it was awesome! I work in schools and with individuals as an empowerment and confidence. These kids definitely did you proud in all these areas. It is so refreshing to see so much positively in one place.
